

## Bursting of sandwiched liquid films

### Description

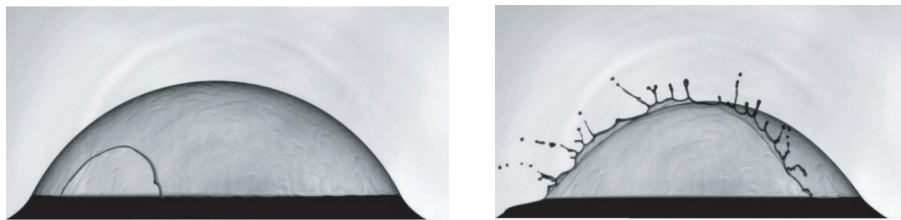


Figure 1: Bursting of an air bubble at an air-water interface (adapted from [1]).

Gas bubbles rising through a liquid spontaneously burst when they reach the water-air free surface (as seen in Fig. 1). The bursting is initiated by the appearance of a rupture on the bubble skin, and is followed by the rapid retraction of the liquid film. The retraction velocity in this case is only dependent on the properties of the surrounding fluid, and not of the gas bubble. If the gas bubble is now replaced by an oil (lighter than water) droplet, a similar bursting and retraction is observed at the free surface. However, in this case, the retraction velocity also depends on the properties of the oil. In both the aforementioned scenarios, bursting occurs at an air-liquid interface, where the air acts as a passive medium. However, very little is known about the retraction behavior when the air is replaced by another liquid. In this study, we will experimentally and/or numerically investigate the bursting and retraction behavior of a liquid film sandwiched between two other liquids.

### What you will do and what you will learn?

In the Physics of Fluids group, we are looking for enthusiastic students to join our newly established project on bursting of sandwiched liquid films.

1. You will learn about film bursting, Taylor-Culick retractions, and viscous dissipation.
2. You will work with experimentalists and/or numericists.
3. You will get hands-on experience on experiments involving state-of-the-art high-speed imaging.
4. You will learn about the Computational Fluid Dynamics (CFD) fundamentals, and use the free software program Basilisk C (<http://basilisk.dalembert.upmc.fr>).
5. You will learn how to do basic and advanced scientific data analysis.
